NEWS IN BREIF

For those new residents in the Rankin area and maybe some older ones too, here is a bit of local history that you may not know about. This was not always a sleepy hamlet. There was a night life to be had if one cared to walk or come by horse back or buggy.

South of Slabtown, on the Pembroke/Eganville Road was a Tavern on Lot 6, Concession 22 Wilberforce Township. The corner only now owned by Mr. Kirk Leach. The original corner lot of fifty acres had a large log house, barn and stables and a bush lot. It accommodated travelers with lodging and entertainment in the bar. Bill Green lived there with his five children -Jenny, Robert, Charlie, Atton and Muriel. Jenny married William James Leach and lived on his farm about a mile Mrs. Evelyn Scheuneman's away. grandfather would send his grandchildren to the hotel with a quarter to bring him a small flask of whiskey. A pail of beer could be bought for twentyfive cents for a small party.

This corner known as Lower Rankin had an Orange hall, a Methodist Church, the Public School, Grey's Store and the Post Office. There were fifty pupils at the school in 1898. There were three in each seat, always a small one in the middle. Some of the families were Bramburgers, Davies', Leaches, Clarks, Chusroskie, Grahl's, Reiche's, Butts, Kidds and Jacksons.

And you can buy them at the Dollar Store . COFFEE FILTERS: Not just for making coffee....

1. Cover bowls or dishes when cooking in the microwave. Coffee filters make excellent covers.

2. Clean windows and mirrors. Coffee filters are lint-free so they'll leave windows sparkling.

3. Protect China. Separate your good dishes by putting a coffee filter between each dish.

4. Filter broken cork from wine. If you break the cork when opening a wine bottle, filter the wine through a coffee filter.
